

Certified Residential Mitigation Providers in Georgia

National Radon Proficiency Programs administered by the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) and the National Radon Safety Board (NRSB)

If your radon test results are 4 pCi/L or higher, you should consider taking action to reduce the dangerous radon level in your home. Lowering high radon levels requires technical knowledge and special skills. Radon mitigators with NEHA and/or NRSB Certification are recommended. Choosing someone to fix your radon problem is much like choosing a contractor for other home repairs—you may want to get references and more than one estimate.

Please note: Individuals holding the Residential Mitigation Provider Certification have completed a radon residential mitigation course, passed the exam, and registered with NEHA and/or NRSB. Certified radon mitigation service providers also agree to abide by local laws as well as the mitigation techniques detailed in the U.S. Radon Mitigation Standards.
