

In addition to the partnership with Live Thrive, the **Do You Recycle?** <u>Challenge</u> brought together local organizations including Atlanta Housing, Livable Buckhead, Georgia Recycling Coalition, Recycles, Atlanta Office of Resilience, and the Atlanta Apartment Association. Since its launch 12 months ago, 27 properties representing nearly 5,000 residential housing units have received improved recycling education. Multifamily properties in Atlanta can still access resources and education through the end of 2022. The Do You Recycle Challenge is part of the multi-family workstream within The Recycling Partnership's three-year, multimillion dollar grant made possible by The Coca-Cola Foundation. In addition to focusing on multi-family communities, the Atlanta project also supported single-family home recycling and recycling programs at the **Member Spotlight: Goodr Company**
