

ICAW-May 2-8, 2021



The ICAW 2021 theme is based on the circular movement of the organics recycling process flowing from farm to table to farm again. This circular process turns recycled organic materials into compost which creates healthy soils leading to more nutrient dense fruits and vegetables, with those scraps going back to being composted and the process starts again. Compost adds carbon back into the soil, promotes erosion control and closes the loop by avoiding the loss of valuable organic resources. From on-farm composting, large-scale commercial composting facilities to community composting and composting in backyards, this amazing resource provides an ecologically responsible option for managing our organic materials.

This year's ICAW 2021 theme, **Grow, Eat...COMPOST...Repeat**, empowers us to recognize and promote the importance of composting and the use of compost in growing healthier food, supporting healthier soils and, ultimately, creating a more just and sustainable world.

(consolidated governments; SWMA) can now participate in the MMP. Re-TRAC has already added 15 counties and regional agencies that either participated in the beta testing phase or applied to join the program. Along with our Georgia municipalities already participating (and we need more of you, too!), this will give us a more comprehensive look at how we're doing. We all know recycling is robust in Georgia, but we need data to back that up.

The MMP™ was designed by <u>The Recycling Partnership</u> & Re-TRAC Connect™ to create a centralized database of local government program information that communities can use to improve recycling in the United States.. Collecting recycling and waste efficiently is crucial to working towards a circular economy and reducing our waste as a whole.

PP Grants Available to MRFs



The Recycling Partnership recently announced a second round of grant funding through its Polypropylene Recycling Coalition, distributing nearly \$1 million in catalytic grants to advance polypropylene (PP) recycling in the U.S. Launched in July 2020, the Polypropylene Recycling Coalition (Coalition) is a cross-industry collaboration supported by steering committee members Keurig Dr Pepper, Braskem, NextGen Consortium, and the Walmart Foundation, along with other members of the polypropylene value chain. Polypropylene, sometimes referred to as No. 5 plastic, is used in an array of food and non-food packaging and is in strong demand as a recycled material.

Through its second round of grant funding, the Coalition will provide an additional three grants to MRFs across the U.S. to boost sortation of PP and support targeted consumer education efforts. To date, the Coalition has awarded grants for seven MRFs across the U.S. These investments aim to improve curbside PP recycling access for an additional 3% of all U.S. households, and increase the recovery of PP by an estimated 4,300 tons annually to be made into new products, like consumer packaging and automotive parts, rather than being sent

to landfills or incineration.
