ROME FLOYD GLASS



A privately-led initiative to resume the recycling of glass in Rome and Floyd County will start in January. Teresa Lartundo will partner with Strategic Materials to bring a large glass recycling dumpster to Rome on Jan. 8. The bin will be placed adjacent to the parking area behind Makervillage on North Fifth Avenue. "We're

going to do a four-month trial period to see if we can fill it up to the top once a month," Lartundo said. "It seems like we have enough interest so far."

The recycling will involve glass materials that are typically used for food or beverage products. The glass can be any color, but not anything like broken windowpanes or broken light bulbs.

ACC INSTALLS BIG BELLY UNITS IN DOWNTOWN ATHENS





The Athens-Clarke County SW Department with assistance of ACC Central Services crews recently made materials management a whole lot better-looking in downtown Athens. In December, crews installed four pairs of Big belly collection containers for trash and recycling collection. The trash side features a solar-powered compactor that will hold more 'waste,' allowing ACC Solid Waste Department to save money on collections. Two more pairs of trash/recyclable containers will complete the installation at College Square. Trash on the right, recyclables on the left. And hey – paper cups are now recyclable in Athens-Clarke County. Clean, empty and into the container loose – not bagged.

ARGLASS OPENS



In early December, a new U.S. bottle plant that will use recycled glass began firing up its furnaces right here in Georgia. According to Glass International, the Arglass Yamamura bottle production facility in Valdosta, Ga, has started heating up its furnaces in preparation for opening. Announced last year, the project will create the first new glass bottle factory in the U.S. in a generation.

The company's CEO previously told Resource Recycling the facility will use recycled cullet. Estimated to cost \$123 million, the plant will have a capacity to produce about 100,000 metric tons of bottles per

year. Arglass Yamamura is a joint venture between Japanese bottle maker Nihon Yamamura Glass Co. and Cambium Arglass, a privately held investment company.

HEFTY ENERGY BAG PROGRAM EXPANDS TO SMYNRA



Smyrna residents who have curbside recycling collect by City of Smyrna Public Works will be able to recycle plastics #3 - 7 and other hard to recycle plastics in their curbside bin using a special Hefty orange bag. The Hefty® Energy Bag® Program is a groundbreaking initiative that collects many of the plastics that are currently hard to recycle and turns them into something useful again instead of sending them to the landfill! Residents were invited to pick up FREE starter kits at the Smyrna Recycling Center or at Utility Billing located in Smyrna City Hall. Replacement bags may be purchased at the Kroger stores in Cobb County.
